

Wakayama is the best place to stay and study



1. Courses

The goal is to obtain enough fluency in the language to allow students to study at colleges, universities and graduate school, engage in business or live in Japan.

* We require applicants to have mastered Hiragana and Katakana before applying.

* As a result of the level check test, we will decide your class. Lessons will be offered in the morning or in the afternoon depending on the class.

* In July and January courses, we do **NOT** offer the Beginner 1 class.

2. Extra-curricular activities

Various extra-curricular activities are held in each semester.



3. Curriculum

Lessons are taught with the goal of developing the 4 basic skills of reading, writing, listening and speaking. The homeroom teacher is always there to support the students for their various questions. Above intermediate level, we offer the elective class for study at university/college or for business conversation.

For Beginner 1 (N5):

- We use “Minna no Nihongo 1” as materials.
- We review the sentence pattern of basic grammar and advance to intermediate.
- We train to acquire natural pronunciation and intonation, skills to compose and comprehend long sentences, and to oral fluency.

For Beginner 2 (N4):

- We use “Minna no Nihongo 2” as materials.
- We review the sentence pattern of basic grammar and advance to intermediate.
- We train to acquire natural pronunciation and intonation, skills to compose and comprehend long sentences, and to oral fluency.

For Intermediate (N3-N2):

- We use “Chukyu kara Manabu Nihongo” as materials.
- We train to master the skills of picking up necessary information, understanding Japanese own speech level and answering correctly for the questions.
- We train to improve the skills of understanding the flow of sentences by rapid reading and intensive reading.
- We train to improve the skills of summarizing long sentences and writing constructed composition.
- We train to pass the level N3 and N2 of Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT).
- We offer the preparatory subject such as Mathematics, science and Social studies classes for Examination for Japanese University Admission for International Students (EJU) , and study at university and college. * Elective class
- We train to improve the skills of basic business conversation. * Elective class

For Advanced (N1-):

- We use “Jidai wo Yomitoku Jokyū Nihongo” and real materials such as article of newspapers.
- We train to improve the skills of listening conversation at various scenes and also understanding the content of TV program and news.
- We train to compose essay and report.
- We train to pass the level N1 of Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT).
- We offer the preparatory subject such as Mathematics, science and Social studies classes for Examination for Japanese University Admission for International Students (EJU) , and study at university and college. * Elective class
- We train to improve the skills of business conversation and writing. * Elective class

4. Student dorm

Students can live at our dorms as soon as they come to Japan.

In the case a student decides to live in the student dorms, they must present the appropriately filled out an application form.

Equipment: Western style room (about 10 m² floor size) with air conditioner, includes a kitchen, bath and toilet

Refrigerator, washing machine, microwave, rice cooker, bed, basic sleeping necessities (futon), TV and desk are fully equipped there. The internet contract is entirely the responsibility of the students.

Fees : 135,000yen for 3months (If two students share the room, it is 67,500 yen per a person.)

*Electricity, gas and water monthly fees are entirely the responsibility of the students, and are to be paid every month in addition to the monthly rent.

5. How to apply

Please prepare the following documents and send them to us by e-mail or post.

1. Application form
2. 4 pieces of ID photos (4x3cm)
3. Copy of a passport (the page of your ID) and a residence card

Payment is requested to be made either in person to the school office or remit into the school's bank account, using the appropriate bank transfer.

◆Tuition: 200,000yen

◆Tuition and Dorm fee: 335,000yen (Double room: 267,500yen)

6. Others

Basic expenses of approximately per month in Wakayama are; rent: 22,500-45,000yen, Electricity, gas and water fees: 3,500-5,000yen, food: 20,000-30,000yen. The total fee is about 46,000-80,000yen.

Students can rent a bicycle, mobile phone and Wi-Fi if they want. (Required the extra fees.)

Furthermore, after school hours, once a week, students may have a one hour Japanese conversation class with a volunteer tutor, and during the weekends, students can have the chance of directly experiencing the everyday Japanese life style (house, food, habits) with a Japanese family.
